From the Rector

Welcome Back from Summer!

I hope your summer was refreshing and rejuvenating, full of adventures in the afternoon sun, and lazy afternoons during the rain. Katie, Addie, and I had a wonderful summer, highlighted by a lengthy trip south to see some family. During one long stretch of interstate, I thought about what makes travel so much fun and interesting, reflecting on the sense of discovery that spending time in a new place inspires. When I travel, I find I am way more attentive and alert to small things — town names, license plate numbers, local customs and favorite places to dine, accents, topography... even church names (my favorite was Little Hope Baptist Church, ha!).



The questions I considered on returning home were "How do I continue to foster this attentiveness, the awakeness to the wondrous and mysterious particularities of my world, even when it's all very familiar? How do I come to realize for myself what GK Chesterton was getting at when he said, 'The whole object of travel is not to set foot on foreign land; it is at last to set foot on one's own country as a foreign land'?"

The first Christians, you may know, weren't called Christians — that title came later. The earliest companions of Jesus were called "Followers of the Way." The first-generation Christ followers discovered a new way of being in the world. Their travels with Jesus changed them. They made a new set of discoveries, set on travelling through their lives with eyes wide open to Jesus' Spirit flashing forth across their path, illuminating their journey, awakening new possibilities.

As I am coming to see it, I think our spiritual community at St. Anne's is here to help us make new discoveries in our lives. As we travel with Jesus – through Ordinary Time, Advent, Epiphany, Lent, Holy Week, Easter, and Pentecost – we come to see the world through his eyes. We come to see the particularities of our own lives with the fresh expectancy that we often have when we travel. The Holy Spirit leads each of us deeper into our lives, and if our hearts aren't exactly a foreign land, they are full of depth, mystery, and beauty, and we share this journey of another year together, eyes wide open to what we might be able to discover within and among us as travelers on Jesus' way.

An Update from your Wardens

There comes a point every August when there's no use denying that darkness falls earlier, and mornings, at least in Maine at our summer cottage, are down-vest chilly. We all know the signs. Apples are ripening in the orchards and there's a stack of back-to-school supplies for St. Stephens kids in the foyer at St. Anne's. Summer is ending and the transition to fall, ready or not, has begun. I hope each of you can come back feeling renewed and refreshed from the quieter summer months whether you travelled far away or just enjoyed your backyard.

We begin our new season with good news to share: under Co-Warden Rob Parker's guidance, we've successfully negotiated and signed a new long-term (10 years) lease for our Terrace Level. The new tenant, Ms. Yanying Liu and her husband, Mr. Kai Bao, plan to open the Lincoln School for Children, a daycare and preschool. Ms. Liu is an experienced daycare/preschool operator (she owns another daycare and is the director of a third) and lives in Harvard, MA. Currently she is working on site improvements and applying for her state license from the Department of Early Education and Care. As many of you recall, our prior tenants included Lincoln Country Day School and, during Covid, the Carroll School. We know that this use of the space is compatible with our church life and we look forward to seeing this latest venture succeed to our mutual benefit.

We've been busy over the summer addressing several pressing property issues with shout-outs to Jennie Cook and Rob Parker for leading the efforts. These include upgrades to our fire suppression systems, replacing the voice alert portion of the fire alarm panel, fixing gutters to solve moisture issues, touching up the paint in Flint Hall and bathrooms, and keeping our AC chiller going for another year. Special thanks to Bob Schudy for gifting and installing the two highly-efficient window air conditioners in our Sanctuary which helped keep temperatures cooler during Sunday services. Thanks also to Lise Stahl Brown, Selina Rossiter, and Deb Howe for sprucing up our Memorial Garden and flagging on-going maintenance needs in this special and sacred site of our campus.

As we look ahead, excitement and planning has begun for celebrating our 150th Anniversary in 2024! Vestry and a Steering Committee are currently working on a parish-wide dinner, forums on our history, a special year-round outreach initiative, a possible speaker series, and much more. If you have ideas or would like to get more involved, we welcome your participation! Please contact me, Lise Stahl Brown, or Garrett directly.

I look forward to seeing familiar and new faces in the pews and hope you can join us on for our Ministry Fair in Flint Hall on September 17 showcasing different commissions and groups at St. Anne's.

New! Centering Prayer & Meditation



Forum Schedule

This fall we will be hosting a variety of adult formation activities, with our first installment, "Prayer as Divine Encounter: Why Do Christians Pray?" at 9 am on September 24 which kicks off a multi-week exploration of how we encounter the Divine. The forums that follow will focus on a range of topics including different ways to pray and the spiritual practices parishioners use to experience God. We will also be supporting a series on "Faith and Fiction," as well as partnering with the Social



Justice Commission for an event on Indigenous spirituality. Last, but certainly not least, in Advent we will again hold a Moth-style story hour over two or three Sunday forums, at which parishioners share stories on a spiritual theme.

The Baptized Imagination: An Exploration of Themes on Spirit in Short Fiction

Social Justice Commission News

This fall the Social Justice Commission (SJC) is excited to coordinate several events: first, we will continue our tradition of having **soup-supper movie nights**, the first of these held on **Friday, September 29**. We invite all parishioners,

their families, and their friends to the screening of *Gather*, an intimate portrait of the growing movement amongst Native Americans to reclaim their spiritual, political and cultural identities through food sovereignty, while battling the trauma of centuries of genocide. The film will be preceded by a soup supper in Flint Hall at 6 pm.

Second, we will be coordinating a group from St. Anne's to attend the annual **Day of Mourning** held in Plymouth, MA, on Thanksgiving Day, followed by a meal together the next day. Third, and more immediately, we encourage all St. Anne's parishioners to consider joining us on **September 17 for the March to End Fossil Fuels in New York City.** Finally, we are pursuing multiple opportunities to learn about and support Indigenous rights, including inviting a member of the Nashobah Praying Indians to speak at St. Anne's (date TBA) and supporting bills endorsed by the Massachusetts Indigenous Legislative Agenda, such as changing the Massachusetts state flag. Fellowship

Reintroducing St. Anne's "Foyer Dinner" Groups: Friendship and Fun!

Foyer Dinner Groups are small gatherings of about six to eight people, made up of singles and couples, who meet informally once every four to six weeks for a meal and fellowship at each other's homes. After a ten-year hiatus, we're going to give this another go! Your commitment is for a three-to-four-month cycle, not a whole year, with each household taking one turn at their home.

What's the history behind Foyer Dinners? After the World War II bombing of Coventry Cathedral, small groups of people began meeting to rebuild their community: a modest meal, conversation. In time, "Foyers" began springing up in parishes all over Britain and America. Many Episcopal churches have Foyers to this day.

I'm a very busy person. Is this for me? Absolutely! The time commitment is small and the payoff is big. Foyers traditionally last about two hours. You'll have great conversations and much fun getting to know people. Be sure to bring your calendar so that the next meeting can be scheduled.

What if my home is too small and/or I don't like to cook? Foyers are meant to be simple and comfortable. The host provides the main course and other participants bring a part of the meal to be shared, such as bread, wine, appetizers, a salad, or dessert. Some people just order pizza – the possibilities are endless. It's up to the group to decide how they want to manage the food part. The main thing is to keep it simple.

I have food allergies. How can I be sure that other group members' meals will be suitable for me? If you have food allergies, dietary restrictions, or strong taste preferences, simply inform your group of your concerns at the beginning so that everyone understands what they must consider in preparing the menu. It's also okay if you bring your own meal each time and just join in the conversation.

St. Anne's Hosts the Community

If you take a peek at our online calendar, you'll be surprised at how much is going on here on the St. Anne's campus! Since the end of the pandemic, we have steadily (re)opened our doors to all kinds of community groups, sharing our beautiful spaces with those who gather for exercise, help, friendship, and fun. Among these renters is Hineini Havurah, a Jewish group that celebrates the High Holidays and Shabbat together each month; the Wayland Garden Club and the New England Chapter of the American Needlepoint Guild, who hold monthly meetings; AA and Alanon, whose members meet every single Wednesday evening without fail; parishioner Holly Kania's movement group, the Nia Collective, who dance away each Wednesday morning; a small women-led Catholic group that occasionally uses the Sanctuary for services; and, various one-off events that include birthday parties, concerts, meetings, alternative worship, and recitals (e.g., the Lincoln Land Trust, Kirtans, Noteworthy Music School, etc.).

While these rentals — and that of the Terrace Level by Lincoln School for Children — bring in vital income for St. Anne's, we are thrilled to be a hub of community activity, a place where people can heal, relax, and celebrate. We welcome our parishioners to use St. Anne's spaces — we do not charge you for personal events and give deep discounts to your associated organizations!
