

Refugee Family: Update

After a rocky start, our extended family of nine Rohingya Muslims is making progress settling into their new lives in Lowell. They arrived on a bitterly cold day in late January, but because the heat wasn't working in their apartment, they crammed into that of the matriarch, Elam, and her youngest son, Nur (18), who arrived a month earlier. We were finally able to move them and their furnishings into the larger apartment on February 14.

Members of St. Anne's and the Interfaith Partnership for Refugee Resettlement have been supporting the family with transportation to the mosque, grocery stores, and medical appointments, and with learning the Lowell bus routes.



Bit by bit, we've been learning more about the harsh conditions they endured in Cox's Bazaar, the world's largest refugee camp, where discrimination, food restrictions, flooding, and gang violence are rampant. The family survived because Yasin (32) took a dangerous boat trip to Kuala Lumpur when he was only 17 to find construction work building skyscrapers. He sent money back, but was unable to see his family for 12 years before he returned, got married, and became a father. Yasin's wife, Rozina, lost family members in the 2017 genocide by the Myanmar military. Yasin's father and one of his sisters died in the camp and the family has been waiting there since 2008 to immigrate. They originally arrived in 1992, so most of them have spent their entire lives in the camp.

The girls, Monora (10) and Arbia (7) have enrolled in school and it's going well. The most exciting development is that two of the men have found jobs! Yasin is working the weekend night shift at a medical lab, and Nur is working at an Amazon warehouse. Sadly, Humira and Abdul, who apparently have long had a troubled marriage, have

separated, and Abdul is living in a rooming house where he shares an attic room. His lack of any English has been a barrier to employment, so a priority now is to provide extra English classes for him.

Our primary financial goal is to assist them with their rent for the first year. enjoyed in Flint Hall where we will also have a chance to have some conversation with Bishop Alan.


Two Musical Events on Pentecost: May 19

Social Justice Commission
